

Charlie drove an excellent race to finish on the podium in 3rd place in FP and another great race to finish 16th in SM. As the photos show Tom had a bigger smile than Charlie.

Regional Racing-In the NARRC Championship Tom Hansen, Dylan Murcott,BK Karl, Bob Karl jr.,Doug Garrison and myself all did well. The final NYSRRC results are not yet posted but as of today the leaders as of press time were: Jon Waterhouse HP, Brian Blizzard ITA, Tom Hansen ITE. David, Ken and Alan Lendrum in SM. Year End Awards- At the MoHud Annual Meeting and Banquet on December 3rd, we will be presenting our drivers with awards. We normally recognize The Driver of the Year, The Rookie of the Year, Most Improved and other awards which are proposed. We also honor the recipient of the Dave Riggi Memorial Mechanic award. It is important that we receive nominations for these awards, if you would like to nominate someone please contact me asap.

Regional Club Racing Championship- It's that time of year again; we will be presenting T-shirts to every driver who enters. The rules are: you can count any 5 SCCA races: they can be Nationals, Regionals, Pro or endures. Mohawk Hudson Races count double. Points are awarded as follows: 1st-20,2nd-15,3rd-12, 4th-10,5th-8,6th-6,7th-4,8th-2 and 9th and higher-1. In addition you receive one point for every car in your class that you beat. Your best 5 races should be totaled. If you worked the MoHud race you may pick another race for your double points. Remember you could conceivably finish 2nd in a race and receive more points for that race than a 1st if the field was larger. 2011 Lincoln Solo Nationals – A Great Vacation

OK, so we did this trip last year without a GPS, but without a major problem. So now we know what to do, how to do it, and what not to do. A piece of cake – right? Wrong!

I spent the days leading up to the big event getting everything ready to rock and roll and loaded up the F150 with everything that might be needed and take nothing that would take up valuable space and never be needed (based on last year's experience).

I hit my shop before 8:00am Thursday morning 9/29/11, the day we decided to start the journey, after my lovely wife Diane got out of work. I hooked up the trailer, and then started up my 89 Mustang engine to load the car on the trailer. Just the sound of this engine always makes me smile. I checked my "To Do" list on the shop wall and tried to decide what I was forgetting – "it's always something" (Thank you Gilda Radner) - so I checked my list twice. I got back to the house early and put the last of the luggage in the truck. We headed west on the NYS Thruway, with great excitement, and about 4 hours later, got off at Exit 46, Victor NY, where there is a Hampton Inn right off the exit. There is also a TGI Friday's right next to the hotel, and we had a great dinner there.

Dark and early Friday morning, we set out west on basically flat terrain. I have figured out how to get better mileage after all these miles of towing. We ate our picnic lunch in a truck stop and continued heading west to Chicago. Everything was going well until we failed to see the miniature sign just inside the Chicago city limits that says I-80 truck detour (we weren't the only ones!) and we blithely followed I-90 into the heart of Chicago in rush hour traffic!!! We were stuck in the biggest parking lot I have ever seen labeled a highway. Hours later, after we literally fought our way through traffic north, we managed to get onto a toll road, I-88. This is a very interesting, super fast toll road, where you pay \$6.00 about every 50 miles, (I wish I had gotten an easy pass before the trip) never see a trooper, and go really fast from Chicago to Iowa. I'm running at 75 mph and getting passed by everyone else like I'm standing still! We pulled into the Davenport, Iowa Residence Inn just before the sun had truly set and got a fantastic dinner just up the road at the Thunder Bay Grille, where you can park a truck and trailer with ease. We found this place last year, as Diane keeps good notes.

Saturday morning, we're up at O dark thirty again, (gas is cheap here!) and head west on I-80. After another of Diane's great picnic lunches at a rest area with nice trees, picnic tables, and a great view of many giant windmills, we hit the Lincoln, NE exit 409 just before 3:00pm. An hour later, after having crossed the city from North to South and back several times, we realized that our old GPS would not accept the address for the fairly new Lincoln Residence Inn. We finally check in at about 4:00pm and head back north to the Lincoln airport to get our rental car. From the airport, we can see the edge of the Solo universe across the ocean of cement. We headed over to the site, and that's when the real fun began!

An appreciation: Donna Deans Fisher 1943 – 2011



From the late 1960s through the mid 1970s Donna Deans Fisher was one of Mohawk-Hudson Region's most enthusiastic autocross competitors.

She arrived in the sport in a rather unusual way. There were a fair number of women who participated in local events (rallyes and gymkhanas – what we now call autocross or solo) but they were usually spouses or the occasional girlfriend. Reflecting the new spirit of liberated women, Donna showed up all on her own with her family's Mercury Cougar, a

bright smile reflecting her sunny disposition. With agility and balance honed from downhill skiing she adapted readily to the cadence of accelerating, braking and turning through the sea of brightly-colored cones. It wasn't long before the Cougar was replaced by a Porsche 914, and her brother John was enticed to join the fun.

Donna energized the social side of the sport too, orchestrating fondue and Mateus dinner parties into not-to-be-missed occasions. Along the way she captured the heart of another MoHud stalwart, Lloyd "Sandy" Fisher. Together they became a dynamic duo.

At that time there were autocross events nearly every weekend from March through November. Whether it was a Mohawk-Hudson or Empire Motor Sports Club event in Albany, BMSC (Berkshire Motor Sports Club) around Pittsfield, or AMEC's high-speed run at Albany-Saratoga Speedway you could usually count on the three Camaros, Sandy, Donna, and Donna's brother John, rumbling onto the scene. At the peak of her involvement you'd often find Donna forsaking the women's category to compete on an even basis with the men; it wasn't uncommon for the V8 "pony car" class to have upwards of a dozen entries, and more often than not Donna would end her day carrying a trophy home.

Her dedication went beyond the exhilaration of being behind the wheel. In a quiet and efficient way Donna pitched in behind the scenes. In those long-ago days before computers you'd often find her hand-tabulating results and inscribing times on long pieces of poster board. She regularly took her turn as event chairman as well as a term as the region's secretary.

As life moved on Donna's adventurous spirit turned to travel, exploring locales as far flung as Costa Rica and Kenya. Even as her autocrossing days grew distant she always spoke fondly of them, holding cherished memories of the camaraderie as well as the competition.

In those Age of Aquarius days Donna also filled the role of unofficial "den mother" over a motley collection of automotive treasures, and the equally motley collection of personalities

trying to keep them mobile. Her humanity and generosity of spirit went a long way towards smoothing over a lot of rough edges, in ways that extended far beyond the realm of roaring engines and spinning tires. That may have been her greatest triumph of all. Godspeed, dear friend.

Membership Meeting Minutes - October 5th, 2011

Meeting called to order at 7:35 pm.

Secretary – minutes from previous month's meeting accepted.

Web – Eric reported that new web site is still being worked on.

<u>Membership</u> – Will gave a summary of new members and their general interests.

Knock Off – email addresses for members are being confirmed.

<u>Treasurer</u> – Chip reported on last month's expenditures and revenues.

<u>Solo</u> – there were 53 entries for the Fortitech Solo event in September. The day before the Solo event, the Region conducted a Street Survival for new drivers. There were 22 students and approximately 24 Instructors. There was a lot of volunteer help from both MoHud as well as BMW CCA Patroon Chapter as well as Auto Solutions who donated the use of a tractor trailer for the school. Bill Wade, the Street Survival national director, attended and did the classroom instruction. He indicated that the Mo Hud school was one of the best first time schools he has ever attended (of over 80 he's attended). The local Glenville paper did cover the event. BMW CCA provided the food (lunch) for the event. The National Guard provided a pumper and staff to keep the skidpad surface wet. The Region received two emails from parents after the school, saying the skills their children had learned helped them avoid accidents in the week following the school.

A motion was made to split half the profits from the Street Survival with BMW CCA and half of the MoHud profits be donated to the SCCA Street Survival Foundation (which provides support to SCCA regions putting on a Street Survival school).

Motion was tabled for further discussion by the Board, who will report back next month with a recommendation. A lot of the parents attending the event with their children expressed an interest in being able to attend a similar type of school for themselves. This will be considered when next year's Solo program is scheduled.

Rally - no report.

PDX – event is scheduled for October 22. Additional Instructors are needed.

<u>Activities</u> – Winter Go Kart event – the Region will explore putting on a "race" series for the upcoming winter season.

<u>Competition</u> – Jack Hanifan provided a summary of MoHud finishes in recent national races as well as the recent Watkins Glen "Fun One".

<u>Old Business</u> – Mini Con will be Nov $4 - 6^{th}$. Jack Hanifan asked if members would remain after the general membership meeting to discuss volunteer needs for the event. Holiday banquet will be Saturday, December 3^{rd} , at the Troy Elks. More info will be posted in the next KO and posted on the website.

<u>New Business</u> – officer slate for next year needs to be finalized. Dick agreed to help with the nominating committee. Chip stated that he will not be running for Treasurer next year. Meeting adjourned at 8:30 pm.
