April SOLO Report

As we get closer to the start of the 2016 season, Every time I write these articles I am either recapping an event or letting you know what is coming up. I always forget that there are new to Solo people out here that may not know what to expect when going to a Solo event. Please forgive me for forgetting you. As most of you that have gone to one of our events know, I try to do whatever I can to help out the new people. So in this issue I want to try to let you know

What to Expect at a SOLO Event

When you show up to an event for the first time, let us know. If you don't plan on competing, that is fine. We can help you understand what we are doing. We may even be able to get a ride in someone's car so you can see firsthand how much fun it is. If you are coming for the first time to compete, you will need to get your car ready. Prior to arriving you have a few things to do.

Check and top off all fluids. Oil, coolant, brake, power steering, and fuel.

Check your tires for condition and air pressure. I always recommend that you put at least 10 psi over normal. You can always let air out, but it is harder to add at an event. Bring an air pressure gauge with you. If you have one, bring a portable air compressor.

Take everything out of the car or secure anything that is loose. Anything that can fly around needs to go. Stuff over your visors, in your door compartments, in your cup holders, floor mats, radar detectors, car battery, etc...

General condition of the car. If it will pass a NYS inspection, chances are it will pass our Tech. Just keep in mind that some items that the state checks are not needed for our events (i.e. Emission controls).

The next thing to prepare is you. You will be in a parking lot for the good part of a day. Prepare for the weather. Is it hot? Cold? Dry? Wet? Windy? Sunny? Dress for it. Bring a lunch and snacks. Bring some drinks. We have a limited supply of water on hand if you forget, but it doesn't last long.

Finally it is time to compete. Arrive early. We usually start setting up at 7 am. Registration closes at 9:15. If you are not changing tires, 8:00 should be about the latest. There is a lot to do before the start.

First off is to register. You will need your driver's license or permit in order to compete (unless you are in a go kart). You will need cash or a check to pay your entry. You will need to class your car. Don't worry, we will help, but it is up to you to be classed correctly. Let them know of all changes and modifications to your car. Sign the waiver.

Get your vehicle Tech'ed. Our Chief of Tech walks around and checks the vehicles with a tech card on it where they are parked. He will need to get in the car and under the hood. You can leave it open or be nearby to open it for him. He can also put your class and number on your vehicle via shoe polish or painters tape depending what he has. You can always bring your own. Just remember that it needs to be visible on both sides. For your piece of mind, you should leave unattended valuables at home. We have never had an issue, but we cannot be held responsible.

Course walk. This is the only time you will see the course before you drive it. Ask someone to explain what the cones mean (pointers, gates, walls, etc). Walk the course as you would drive it. Imagine the width of your vehicle and walk accordingly. Don't walk in a way that your car can't drive (90° turns, etc). Plan where to turn, slow, and accelerate. Generally how you walk the course is how you will drive it. Walk the course as many times as you can and ask for pointers from others as you walk. We usually have a novice walk to show you where to be and what to look for.

<u>Start of the event</u>. We rely on the entrants to work when not running. For the majority of people this means resetting cones that have been hit. The work/run order will be given at the drivers meeting. While working, watch others to see what they are doing. While driving, take it easy on your first run. The course is a lot different at driving speed as it was at walking speed. Most often if you make

a mistake on the first run, you will continue to make the same mistake. And remember that we are here to help. If you want help, please ask. We don't mind.

During the event we keep moving. We do not take breaks. We have a few minutes between heats to get cars from paddock to grid. Use this time to grab a snack and or drink, sunblock, etc... We will run the events rain or shine. If there is lightning in the area we will stop until it has passed. Keep in mind that the faster we can switch between heats, the more runs we can have.

At the end of the event. If there is time, we may do some fun runs. These are open to any registered driver in any registered car. We charge \$2 per run. When all is done we need to pick up and pack all of the equipment away. Anyone that wishes to help with this can and it is always appreciated. Results and trophies will be awarded after that is completed. Please remember that when you leave that you are still representing the club and to obey traffic laws.

The most important things to remember are to have fun and to ask for help (we are more than willing to help). Your first few times are a learning experience (although you never stop learning). You have never done anything like this before so don't set your expectations too high.
