Orchard Tavern, Albany, New York; Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm.

Attending: Jim Bucci (Presiding), Paul Malecki, Eric Smith, Bruce Kosakoski, and Ron Bass.

Treasurer - general discussion about Mo Hud 2017 and 2018 finances. Issues discussed including the SCCA audit function and debit vs. credit cards issued to officers and event chairpersons.

General Membership Meeting Minutes, January 7, 2018

Orchard Tavern, Albany, New York Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm. January meeting minutes accepted unanimously.

Treasurer report - last month's income/expenses summarized.

Membership - no membership report provided.

Solo - the committee met on Saturday February 10. Seven events are planned for the upcoming year. We are waiting for approval from the State for use of the venue. (!)

Rally - no report.

Club Racing - NYSRRC, first place in Formula F was awarded to Chip Van Slyke, Tech Party will be Saturday, March 31 at Bob Karls and <u>Saturday, April 14</u> at North County Subaru. Eric smith had his flagging license upgraded to Divisional.

Activities - Guptills monthly car show is the 2nd Monday of each month. We will sign up again for a booth this season.

Club Officers have been asked to prepare job descriptions for the Regional Rep.

New Business - Paul Malecki presented the proposed budget. It was accepted unanimously. Jack Hanafin has vacated his NEDIV council seat. Jim Bucci has taken his place. Mini Con is being restructured to increase interest and attendance - suggestions included more timely agenda, more inclusiveness (it should not be limited to road racing but should include solo and rally). By-laws - regional committee has met and a draft has been prepared (EJ, Russ Gorman, and Bruce). Rich Welty suggested that the by-laws need not be too specific so that administrative flexibility is maintained.

National Convention - Jim and Harry attended the National Convention in Las Vegas and provided a summary of the event. Of interest to the membership – RaceQuip has an agreement with SCCA - they will provide discount prices to members. A new licensed SCCA worker position has been established - Data Tech for data acquisition.

The MoHud Bylaws Subcommittee –

EJ Smith, Bruce Kosakoski, and Russ Gorman, have been meeting recently and have made good progress on putting together a first draft for a proposed revision of the current Mohawk-Hudson Region's Constitution and Bylaws. The official bylaws were last revised in March of 1989, and since then there have been many changes over the years in the realities of how our club operates that have not been reflected in those bylaws.

We have decided to model our region's bylaws on the current SCCA national bylaws, thereby ensuring our region is inline with SCCA National. As part of this re-write, we'll likely also adopt the national concept of having an operations manual, which means we'll need to separate out the more detailed description of officer duties into the proposed operations manual. We hope to have a draft to present to the MoHud Board for feedback soon, and then eventually to the membership for a vote for adoption by the end of 2018.


A copy of the July, 1967, KnockOff has been placed in the hands of the current editorial staff. July, 1967 takes us back to a time when MoHud was just 10 years old.

Gene Birdsley was RE and Dave McClumpha was Assistant RE. Monthly meetings were held at the Circle Inn on Route 9, somewhere near the current Latham 76 Diner. Nothing we could find on the internet indicated its precise location nor the reason for its demise. Perhaps a senior Club member can fill us in.

Among the articles was a defense, written by Roly Heacox, of tough tech-safety standards being set by National. The basic message was: "It's for your own good..." A throwback to June of 1957 noted that Roly was being welcomed into MoHud at that time.

Back in 1967 the Club gave points for any sort of involvement in activities, but there was no mention of what the podium awards might be. Eleanor Morris had 50 points at mid-year, but no score recorded for Karl.

Gymkhana (*Solo* to you young'uns) was big, as it is now. The "Challenge of Sebring" brought out 37 drivers, with Phil Groggins in his Lotus Elan having fastest outright time. They had some sort of Index of Performance (PAX), but it's not clear how it worked or who won.



Lastly, the current KO staff marvels at the hard work of their predecessors in turning out a newsletter by typing and handdrawing on stencil masters to be used on a mimeograph machine. Ugh!

Advice for Novice Racers
