65 Years of Having Fun With Cars

On January 24th, 1956, Judge Willard L. Best, JSC, sitting at Supreme Court Chambers in Fulton, approved the application of Tom M. Petty, Jr., Bates H. Murphy, Malcom S. Buffum, Arthur L. Albee, Jr., Edwin H. Hull to incorporate the Mohawk-Hudson Region, Sports Car Club, Inc. under the New York Membership Corporations Law. The incorporators were mostly engineers employed by General Electric in Schenectady.

The purposes of the Club included "To stimulate and promote an interest in the ownership and operation of sport cars... to hold events... to act as a source of technical information... [and] to provide and maintain a suitable clubhouse and roadways for the use and recreation of its members..."

Because bureaucratic paperwork can be maddingly slow, it took until 1995 for the Federal IRS to determine that MoHud qualified as a 501 (C) (4) organization exempt from paying Federal Income Tax. That year the State of New York also recognized that MoHud is not liable for the franchise tax on related non-business income.

Bill Hoover was first RE, 1957. Roly Heacox, our oldest surviving member, took over from Bill in 1958.

The 50th Anniversary KnockOff "Commerative Issue" contained an informal and nicely illustrated history of the Club up to 2006. Greg Rickes with the help of Clark Nicholls and others will be reminiscing about the first 50 year and updating us on the following 15. Salvatore Baisley has chipped in by designing the 65th Anniversary logo now seen on the MoHud website.

Despite the many achievements and adventures of the last 65 years, MoHud still does not have a clubhouse with roadways. And although several current members have thought out a business plan to acquire and maintain a facility, we're not much closer to making a down payment. But it sure makes for great conversation during the winter months!

- MoHud currently has 296 members a 20% loss
- memberships numbers are based on recruiting new members and maintaining our current members
- In 2020 MoHud saw 116 memberships lapse, high for the region
- only 43 people signed up for new full-time memberships in 2020, about half of what the club usually sees
- The pandemic and losing our Solo site contributed to these losses
- Our region is at its lowest member count since at least 2011
- Compared to other regions only 5 did worse, 110 regions had better membership numbers
- SCCA nationally began 2020 with 43,806 members and finished with 44,414 members
- 44% of SCCA regions lost members in 2020



Track -- Time Trials and Track Nights

The 2020 Track Star Award

2020 is the second year for the MoHud Track Star award. This award was set up to encourage participation in Track Night events as well as SCCA Time Trials events. Over the last two seasons more and more MoHud members can be espied attending Track Nights and performing well at Time Trials events.

For a season that appeared to be written-off and had a delayed start, I think many were able to do the best they could in the truncated season. Speaking for myself, I was able to attend the Time Trials National Tours at Thompson, GingerMan Raceway and New Jersey Motorsports Park (Lightning). Knowing that attending Nationals was a stretch, appears to have pushed me to attend these other events. I got to drive two new tracks and also attend Track Night and Patroon BMW CCA Driver School events at Lime Rock Park.

The Thompson event was special for the SCCA as it marked the 75th anniversary of the first ever on-track SCCA event, a time trials at Thompson Speedway that featured Time Attack as well as Track Sprints. MoHud showed up in force which was impressive given that all of us here in the region went through a very bleak period during the early months of the pandemic. MoHud members were present to not only help facilitate the smooth functioning of the event, but also to participate. As I think back to the event there are several stories worth telling or retelling, but for the purposes of the Track Star awards, here are the ones that matter.

Mohawk Hudson Track Star Honorable Mentions:

Salvatore Baisley and **Adam Wright** are honorable mentions for this year's Track Star awards.

Sal Baisley showed up as Adam's guest/crew member. But having got there, he offered to help and was out by the garages cheerfully working grid even though he did not sign up to work. Watching him in action was a live example of the values of the SCCA – Excellence, Service, Passion, Team, Experience and Stewardship. He could have easily chosen to tailgate by Adam's RV given he was recovering from an injury, but Sal was in the thick of the action, helping cars line up by times set and moving them around calmly when someone got into the wrong spot. In doing what he did, Sal played a key role in MoHud winning the Spirit of Time Trials award and is therefore one of our honorable mentions for the Mohawk Hudson Track Star.

For someone that hopped on track for the first time just prior to last years' Time Trials National Tour, Adam did very well to finish on the podium in the Tuner 4 category last year. Proving that this was not a case of beginners' luck, Adam came back stronger this season and has perhaps done more events on track than any other Mohudder. In addition, he also played a part in getting someone out on track plainly out of the generosity of his heart. He fought hard for a third-place finish with two other competitors that saw them finish within hundredths of each other, eventually finishing fourth. And as hard as he was driving, he still extended hospitality of his RV to others as well as his help to work on their cars. For all of this and the work he does to get word out about Time Trials and Track Nights, Adam is another of our Honorable Mentions for the Mohawk Hudson Track Star.

He came to this year's event as a favorite to win the Tuner 4 class again. On Day 1, after setting a time, Nick had an on-track incident with another competitor. The car had incurred damage and a lesser person would have called it and driven home. But Nick is cut from a different cloth. After having a polite discussion with the other competitor that resulted in both of them choosing to take the high road, Nick put the incident out of his head and worked away at fixing the car. The paddock and all of MoHud came together to help, but it was Nick's determination and hard work that ensured he was back on grid in the morning for the Track Sprints as well as the afternoon Time Attacks. Nick eventually finished second in the Tuner 4 class making all of MoHud proud to see one of us bounce back.

Congratulations to our Track Stars and wishing them the very best for the 2021 season. The Time Trials committee intends to present the awards in January, time and place TBA. 
My graduating yearbook bio began: "Loves sports cars..." Still do.

February- Another Significant Anniversary

Eleanor Morris - 55 years

My love of speed began early. I was just three years old when I saw my first race – midgets at the new Empire Speedway in Menands, NY. In my teens I tried to get into drag racing but in spite of the rise of Shirley "ChaCha" Muldowney the local hot rod clubs wouldn't take girls. Then in college, I became a founding member of the Viking sports car club on campus at HVCC. When I learned about SCCA and that they accepted women, I joined the Mohawk-Hudson Region in February 1966.

It took me three years to meet someone with whom I could partner. Karl Danneil raced a C/SP Elva Mk II car and we formed Tiger Enterprise. In the spring of 1971 I bought an NTM D/SR. I earned my competition license at Watkins Glen that year, and my National license in 1972. I believe I was the second woman Mo-Hud member to hold a racing license. Mo-Hud awarded me "Most improved Driver" of 1971.

I raced the NTM for five years and won three races: two Regionals at Thompson, and a National race at Bridgehampton. I also ran four Skip Barber school Formula Ford races. 1976 was my best year with the NTM. I won a National, finished 4th in class in NeDiv in the National Championship and was invited to the National Run-Offs at Road Atlanta.

We both went to Atlanta. Since we had only one car and partner Karl out ranked me (he was 2nd in NeDiv), we decided he should qualify first. The car was damaged during practice, and I never got to drive at Atlanta. The NTM never raced again and neither did I.
