Having Fun With Cars – starter videos

If you're having trouble explaining – or learning – the varieties of all those SCCA competition programs and classes, the mothership and Hoosier Tires have teamed up to produce a series of short videos called the Hoosier Shop Manual Series. Hoosier Super Tour: Virginia International Raceway: April 9-11, 2021

According to *Race Monitor*, MoHud was represented by four drivers at what was pretty much the first race of the season for Northerners.

Charlie Campbell ran his FP Miata to a 1st, but appears to have completed only 9 of 13 laps in a second race. His SM Miata did not get him to a podium during the weekend. We expect a Campbell Racing Report to show up next month for a more complete story.

Chris Brassard, Jeff Lehner and Patrick Stringer appeared to have fun in their SRF3 sports racers within a field of 46 cars.

What's an SRF3? It's a Spec Racer Ford Generation 3. The cars are rear-engined, full-bodied, tube-frame, center-seat racers whose 1.6 liter Ford engines, 5-speed transmissions, electronic control units, and shocks are all sealed by SCCA Enterprises to assure no car has a 'cheater' advantage. With some 1,000 SRFs of all generations built, the class rivals all flavors of the Mazda Miata in numbers raced. Jessica Lendrum - A member of the Lendrum racing family.


Twenty Years

The MoHud Saga--- 2017 to 202021

2017

It's an auspicious start to the year when Mohawk-Hudson Region is presented with the "Tom Burke Award" at the SCCA National Convention. The Burke Award recognizes exemplary efforts to grow and activate the SCCA.

There's great anticipation for the SCCA National Championship Run-Offs, which will be held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

It's time for another winter-ish Rallye. Not the Snowflake, but the 4 Points, on March 4.

There's a jovial April 1 special edition of The Knock-Off. Who knows what a Curta Calcuator is?

In real news The 4 Points Rallye offers a unique format: entrants were given a list of four destinations, no exact address and only a couple of clues, and they had to find each destination using maps to determine their own ideas of the shortest/best route.

Nearly all of the teams finished the rally with a total mileage difference of less than 15 miles (and within 20 miles of the Rallymaster's total mileage). In a closely fought contest victory goes to the team of Tom Patnode and Iris Meadows.

It's a gorgeous spring day for the first Street Survival program. Meanwhile at Palmer the region's racers get rolling. Joe Nolette notches a trio of wins in his T1 BMW, ditto for Evan Karl (and a new lap record) in Spec Miata. Jonathan Ericksen adds a win in P1. Charlie Campbell's national championship quest gets a boost with a victory in the F Production race at Pittsburgh International Race Complex, then continues his Pennsylvania streak with a win at Pocono.

Guilderland teenager Yuven Sundaramorthy embarks on an ambitious rookie season, contesting Formula F at SCCA Majors races and the Formula Race Promotions F1600 Championship. It's a year made even more memorable when he scores his first ever race win, and it comes at the FRP event at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway! Ponder that for a moment!

The autocross season rolls along with strong entries, mostly good weather, and technical innovations. Event results are now available in real time on your smartphone. Unusual sights include Dave Burnham's homebuilt Citroen/Maserati powered ice racer, and Paul Malecki's E-Type Jaguar winning the vintage champagne award, along with 8 year old Angela McCleod in the Junior Kart class.

Charlie Campbell, Greg Goss and Jared Lendrum wrap up a busy summer of racing by clinching class championships in the Northeast Division, guaranteeing entry for the National Championship RunOffs.

The Watkins Glen July Sprints prove a popular attraction for local racers, with a dozen on hand, Class wins go to George Klein (EP), Chris Brassard (SRF), Pete Smith (FP) and Jon Ericksen (P1).

At the National Championship Run-Offs Charlie Campbell has mixed fortunes. The F Production car is a DNF with brake problems, while the SpecMiata provides lots of racing as Charlie overcomes qualifying problems that put him in in 62nd (!) starting position. Amazingly the SM races goes full distance without a full-course caution, with Chargin' Charlie passing 19 cars to finish 43rd. Yuven Sundaramorthy is right in the picture for a Formula F podium until a tap from behind spins him out of contention on the final lap.

Back home, early November brings the "Highway to History" Rallye. Eight teams take part, including five teams that were newcomers to the region and rallying. Andrew, Sarah and young Ayrton Servis team up for the win.

Jack Hanifan is presented with the annual Brian Holtz Award for dedication to the SCCA and its Northeast Division. Former dirt-track sprint car racer Jonathan Eriksen is named NEDiv Rookie-of-the-Year.

Capping another successful autocross season produces an array of statistics and awards. Average event attendance is up to 59 (helped along by a hefty 81 at the seventh and final event), but only 13 make every event (down from 18 the year before). On the awards side Novice of the Year goes to Andrew Decker. Most Improved Driver is Chris Keenan. Perennial Female Driver Of The Year is Tracey Burckhard, and Joe Staude takes top honor as Driver Of The Year. Tom Moeller is recognized as Worker of The Year. The Outstanding Performance Award (which hasn't been presented since 2006) goes to Tom Taft.

Evan Karl tops the MoHud Regional Club Racing Championship, Jim Bucci and Chip VanSlyke are class champions in the New York State Road Racing Championship, Chad Mulhall is Rookie of The Year, and Jon Eriksen takes the honors as Driver of The Year.

The Lewis/McClumpha Trophy for outstanding service to the region is presented to Eric Smith. Membership at the end of 2017 is 426.

2018

Paul Malecki joins the Executive team as Treasurer

MoHud marks a pair of milestone membership anniversaries: Roly Heacox, at 60, and John Sheridan at 45.

The autocross program takes a setback when, for unexplained reasons, the OGS Lot on McCarty Avenue is no longer available. Disappointment turns to elation when a new site at the Empire State Aero Museum at Schenectady County Airport comes online.

The April 1 "Special Edition" of The Knock-Off announces that Mohawk-Hudson Region will soon have its own 30,000 square foot clubhouse, autocross pad, and racing circuit on 12.5 acres on Riverview Road in Rexford. To accommodate the financing, monthly membership dues will increase to 77.65 per month.

After decades at The Orchard Tavern the time has come for MoHud to seek a new location for monthly meetings. The new autocross site at ESAM proves to be a popular attraction, with over one hundred entries for the first event.

Campbell Racing goes all the way to Wisconsin for the Super Tour event, only to blow up the engine in the F Production Miata at the Thursday test day. Weekend over.

There's growing popularity for Solo Karts, both grown-ups and Juniors, at autocross events, earning them a feature article in The Knock-Off.

Maggie's Café on Western Avenue in Albany comes on-board as the new meeting location, reprising a role it held in the mid 1970s (under another name).

Extensive due diligence brings forth a comprehensive update of the region's bylaws.

Aashish Vemulapalli is totally smitten by the SCCA's new Time Trials program, and extols the praises of the first ever TT National Championship (held at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green Kentucky) in a comprehensive report for The Knock-Off.

Campbell Brothers Racing makes the long haul to the West Coast for the National Championship Run-Offs. It's bad luck for SpecMiata as a problematic week ends with a early DNF with fuel pump woes, but that disappointment is more than offset by the elation of Charlie's third place finish in the F Production Miata. Along with the Campbells, Bruce Kosakoski and Harry Adalian make the trek to Sonoma to work as Data Techs, a new element of the SCCA's racing program.

It's a festive season for awards. On the racing side Bill Dergosits wins the region's Racing Championship with a fruitful season in his B Spec Mazda 2. Chip VanSlyke is the New York State Road Racing Championship titlist in Formula F. Driver of the Year goes to Jeff Lehner, who competes in the heavily-populated SpecRacerFord category.

The Bill Lewis/David McClumpha Award for contributions to the region's programs is presented to Peter Kroth. The Dave Riggi Award for outstanding support of the region's racing program is a joint award this time, going to Bob Karl, EJ Smith, Phil Shoemaker, Jared Lendrum, Bill Dergosits, Dave Cowie, and Ron Bass, in recognition of their combined efforts to guide Diane Malecki through the steps of entering the SCCA racing program.

The autocross program continues to be popular. The average attendance for the six event season is 75, with a total of 164 different drivers taking part. 22 make all 6 events, and another 17 only missed one event, all of which underscore the popularity of the site at the Empire State Aeroscience Museum (ESAM) at Schenectady County Airport. At the end of the season Steve Palleschi is recognized as Novice Driver of The Year, Ken Relation is Most Improved.

More Autocross: In a close battle Katherine Hogan is Female Driver of the Year, and Nick Austin is Autocross Driver of the Year. Expanding on the previous Worker of The Year, the autocross program now awards Spirit of Solo for noteworthy contributions; the 2019 awardees are Miguel Texeira, Joe Cassidy, Ray Waxali, and Tracey Burckhard.

Membership at year's end is 440.

2019

A bit delayed, but there's a full report on November's "Fall Back" Rallye. It's the first try at a true TSD (Time/Speed/Disatance) in quite awhile. Unexpected excitement includes a tree falling down across some power lines along the rally route, but when all the drama was over the win goes to Ken and Michelle Relation.

Long-time region member (he was a course marshall at the MoHud drivers' school at Lime Rock in 1966) Carlton Foster passes away early in February.

Monthly membership meeting is on the move again, to Lynn's Uptown Tavern on Colvin Avenue.

The April 1 "Special Edition" of The Knock-Off explores the unique motoring history of a rare car called The Cyclops.

The SCCA's new Time Trial Tour program includes an Independence Weekend date at Thompson.

The May membership meeting is a special treat, taking place at Jeremy Baye's 1945 Speed & Custom Shop on River Street in Troy.

Rich Welty produces a series of YouTube videos to help explain the intricacies of SCCA's racing technical inspection. Aashish Vemulapalli reports on his latest Track Day experience, at Bushy Park on the island of Barbados!

Charlie Campbell has another hard-chargin' day, starting 69th (out of 70) in SpecMiata at the Hoosier Super Tour race at Virginia International Raceway. By the time the checkered flag comes out he's passed 36 cars!

Autocross season opens at ESAM with 61 entries. Thanks to efficient organization everyone gets SEVEN runs. MoHud members enjoy success at the New England Region race at Palmer. Class wins go to George Klein (E Production Caterham 7), Jared Lendrum (Touring 3 Subaru), Bill Dergotis (B Spec Mazda 2) and Maclin Noray (Touring 4). Evan Karl makes it a double, winning SpecMiata and STL.

The Spring Street Survival (sposored by Tire Rack) at the Saratoga Auto Museum draws another capacity entry, and enthusiastic support from the MoHud membership who staff the event.

Evan Karl and Jared Lendrum have perfect weekends at New Hampshire Motor Speedway. It's a trifecta of wins for Lendrum in T3, and a daily double trifecta for Karl, 3 wins in SM, and another three in SM2.

Closer to home Chip Van Slyke (Formula F), George Klein (E Production Caterham 7) and Jon Waterhouse (H Producion MINI) take class wins at Lime Rock.

Travelin' man Aashish Vemulapalli treks to the Pittsburgh International Race Complex for the Time Trial Tour event and comes home with a third place trophy.

Tough news for the autocross program as the popular ESAM site is no longer available due to deteriorating pavement. The search is on for a new location.

There's strong MoHud representation at the Time Trial Tour event at Thompson, with 9 entries. Michael Park and his Corvette are fastest in the Novice category. A good time is had by all with both track activities and social events, highlighted for many by a stop at Thompson's legendary "Bogie's" ice cream stand.

The autocross program gets back under way by trekking to Berkshire Mall in Pittsfield, long-time home of the Berkshire Motor Sports Club. Proving there's no shortage of enthusiasm in Western Massachussets the opening event draws 60 cars.

After the traditional August meeting/gokart night at The Funplex, Diane Malecki arranges for a new monthly meeting spot at the Gateway Diner in Albany.

Results-wise it's a tough week for Jim Garry at the National Championship Autocross in Lincoln Nebraska but his many long-term contributions to the autocross program at all levels, from local events to the national level, are recognized when he is awarded the SCCA's "Solo Cup". Did you know it was Jim who came up with the name "Tour" for the nation-wide series of autocross events? He was also one of the pioneer Solo Safety Steward instructors.

Northern Division racing class championships go to Charlie Campbell (F Production Miata) and Jason Smith (A Sedan Ford Mustang). At the Watkins Glen Fun One Bob "BK" Karl hangs up his helmet for the final time, having seen his family through three generations of SCCA racing. Grandson Evan makes the occasion memorable by winning the one-hour enduro in his #18 Miata.

There's an enthusiastic contingent from MoHud that makes the journey to Kentucky for Time Trial National Championship. Best performance is by long-time autocrosser Alex Schipkov who takes a class third.

At the road-racing National Championship Run-Offs at Virginia International Raceway Charlie Campbell has a stunning racelong duel for the F Production win, missing out on the checkered flag in a photo finish. The official margin of victory was .096 of second. After three previous third-place finishes, the runner-up spot is his best Run-Offs result. It matches a pair of Run-off runner-ups scored by MoHud's Phil Groggins in 1965 and '66.

MoHud also has a strong turnout on the operational side of the Run-Offs: Eric Smith, Peter Kroth, Rich Alexander, Leigh McBride, Mac McCormack, and former MoHud member (he's now out at Indianapolis) Bryan Deane all report for duty at the flag stations, and Harry Adalian and Bruce Kosakoski get a look at the analytical side in their role as Data Techs.

As another season comes to an end it's time to look back on the accomplishments of our diverse members. It's an abbreviated three event season for the autocross program. Average attendance nonetheless held up with only a slight drop to 69, though total entries were down to 127. That notwithstanding, the number of competitors making every event climbed from 22 to 27. Novice Of The Year is Shelby Blanchette, Matt Huchro is Most Improved, Tracey Burckhard regains the title of Female Driver of the Year and Scott Monti is Autocross Driver of the Year. Spirit of Solo recognition goes to Sal Baisley, Saul Morse, and Sherry DeJan.

The region institutes a new award, The MoHud Track Star, to recognize members who participate in Track Night and Time Trial events. The award is based not only on performance, but also dedication, innovation and enthusiasm. Dan Gorss, who has participated in more Track Night in America events than any other driver nationwide, as well as taking his first try at the Time Trial program, is the inaugural MoHud "Track Star".

On the racing side, Bill Dergosits (B Spec Mazda2) wins the MoHud Road Championship, Maclin Noray (T4 Subaru) is Rookie of the Year, and Jason Smith (A Sedan Ford Mustang) is Driver of the Year.

Two region awards also undergo a name change. The Lewis/McClumpha Trophy for outstanding dedication and participation in regional activities, is renamed The Mohawk-Hudson Member Of Excellence. Rich Alexander is the first recipient. The Dave Riggi Award is renamed the Spirit of The Competitor, and is presented to Greg Goss. The region's Worker Appreciation Award is presented to Arn Beebe,

The year starts on a somber note as long-time member, racer, and regional officer Jack Hanifan passes away after a long illness. Jack's membership dates back to the mid 1970s, and his dedication to the region, and SCCA, is legendary. Long before there was such a thing as #FunWithCars, Jack and his inseparable sidekick Pete Smith were MoHud's Dynamic Duo. They could have been the poster boys for getting the most enjoyment out of SCCA activities. Jack started off autocrossing a FIAT 124 Spider, moved into racing with a Showroom Stock Ford Pinto, spent many winter days ice racing at places like Warners Lake, raced in pro events with IMSA's Firestone Firehawk series and the SCCA Volkswagen Bilstein Cup, and won titles in the North Atlantic Road Racing Championship (NARRC) and the New York State Road Racing Championship. Over his long tenure he served as both a regional officer, and an administrator in the SCCA's Northeast Division.

With Jack's passing, and Pete sidelined due to health concerns a colorful and vibrant era comes to an end. Little did we know how all of our lives wouldl be changing in just a matter of a few weeks.

With the onset of the Covid Pandemic in mid-March all of the hopes and aspirations for the upcoming season of motorsport are put on hold, as we all learn about social distancing, quarantine, community spread, and a whole array of new behaviors as our identities are outwardly masked. Thanks to nifty technology the monthly membership meeting makes a transition to ZOOM, enabling members to keep in touch amidst so much personal isolation.

Restrictions imposed by the pandemic make it even more challenging than usual for the autocross program, with social-distancing and other protocols imposed on top of the difficulty of finding event locations. Three summer events at Tech City in Kingston make up a limited schedule but get enthusiastic support.

The SCCA Time Trial National Tour returns to Thompson Speedway Motorsports Park for Independence Day weekend, and also the 75th anniversary of the SCCA's first track event, which was a Time Trial held at the original Thompson Speedway in July of 1945. Along with lots of close competition MoHud is recognized for the effort put in by its members to participate, promote, and volunteer at the event. In addition to a comprehensive event report, The Knock-Off reprints the original event recap from 75 years ago.

A few weeks later also at Thompson there's a new format as New England Region presents road-course racing after dark on a Saturday night. With the permanent lighting on the stock car oval and some temporary lighting on the rest of the course it proves to be a popular attraction. It's the familiar orange and white #18 of Evan Karl in the winner's circle in SpecMiata. September brings a new social experiment, an outdoor meeting/ice cream social and informal car show at Guptil's. The concept is well-received with around 40 members on hand for the festivities.

Aashish Vemulapalli makes the trek to Michigan for the Time Trial Tour event at Gingerman Raceway. While he doesn't win a performance award he's named a Time Trial Champion for his on-going support and enthusiasm for the TT program.

Evan Karl concludes a short but notable season with a trifecta of SpecMiata wins at the Thompson finale.

It' a frustrating year for Charlie Campbell, and his brother and crew chief Tom, at the Championship Run-Offs at Road America in Wisconsin. A broken transmission in SpecMiata qualifying puts Charlie back in 51st starting position (among 70+ cars). In the SM race he gains a spectacular 29 positions but still can't latch on to the lead pack and finishes 21st. The F Production car casts its own issues, not quite on the pace it showed at the June Sprints, qualifying 8th but ending the day early with mechanical problems.

With a sparse racing schedule SRF drivers Jeff Lehner and Pat Stringer brave the cold and rain to close out the season at New Jersey Motorsports Park in late October. They put their ice racing skills on display to score a victory apiece against the "southerners".

Ken Relation takes over as Rallye Director. In early November, despite numerous challenges, he organizes "How'd We Get Here", which explores the Barge Canal/Mohawk River transportation corridor Eleven teams take the start, and the Burckhard family expands their expertise beyond autocross to score the win.

Later that month the region undergoes a significant transition as Regional Executive Jim Bucci steps down, as move south to Florida reaches fruition for Jim and Trish. Though the region gains an annex in the Sunshine State it loses the direct involvement of two of its most dedicated members.

As this year unlike any other comes to an end Ron Bass ends his tenure as Secretary. Ron demonstrated true dedication to the club by serving in this role for 11 years. That's the longest continuous service by any elected officer. With Jim Bucci's departure Eric Smith becomes Acting RE.

Not surprisingly the annual awards process also undergoes modification. Presentation of autocross awards is postponed until sometime in 2021. The second annual Track Star award goes to Nick Austin, with Honorable Mention to Adam Wright and Salvatore Baisley. The only racing honor awarded is Driver Of The Year, to Evan Karl. Clark Nicholls receives the Member of Excellence.

Tom Campbell is inducted into the SCCA Hall of Fame, recognizing his long commitment to the club in a variety of roles from competitor to Area Governor to CEO of SCCA Pro Racing.

Not surprisingly by the end of the year membership shows a decline, to 299
