Solo site acquisition: We're pleased to announce we've teamed up with NYS Office of General Services to run a series right *on* the Empire State Plaza! Tire Rack has offered their services to assist our members selecting tires that are best suited for marble courses, as opposed to the normal asphalt/concrete norms. Should be exciting! The First 20v Unveiled



Master modeler Peter Kroth, coming off his assembly of a Lego F1 McLaren in world-record time, built what may very well be the very first 20v in the country last weekend. Using leftover Legos from the McLaren project, and parts made on a 3-D printing machine at Michael's Art Supply, he has assembled a car that is dimensionally correct but much lighter than a standard Formula V chassis. "Took the offsets right from Ron Bass' car, so it's got to be within the rules," he noted.

There is a certain irony in that he sanded down the rough edges of the Legos with a Dewalt DCF880H drill/sander powered by the very same 20v MAX battery that will power the car during it's shakedown on April 18th at Lime Rock.


MoHud member Caleb Pocock has been spotted practicing his soufflé technique in preparation for the event.
