Only Jeffrey selected an interest and he listed Club Racing, Solo, and Time Trials.



MOHUD'S UNIQUE PLACE IN RACING HISTORY - BY GREG RICKES



With the dedication of pavement at Lime Rock that extends from the exit of the Esses to the Uphill in honor of Paul Newman it's worthy of note to re-tell the role the Mohawk-Hudson Region played in the racing career of arguably SCCA's most famous member.

Also, showing my age, and acknowledging this was half century ago ago, I wonder if I need to provide some more general background? Paul Newman was an acclaimed cinema actor for several decades. Among his best-known works were "The Sting", "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid", "Cool Hand Luke", and "Slap Shot". In a bit of art imitating life, he was also the voice of "Doc Hudson" in the animated favorite "Cars".

Newman, or "PLN" as he was colloquially known, developed a passionate interest in auto racing springing from his role in "Winning". He pursued this avocation by taking up racing, with SCCA, at age 47 in 1972.

Here's where MoHud comes into the picture. Newman's first race after completing drivers' school, was at Thompson Raceway's road course in June of 1972. It was a regional race, and it was organized by none other than Mohawk-Hudson Region!



PLN had more than his share of drama getting through the drivers school; for various reasons he had to use several cars to complete the full range of track sessions. When he arrived for his racing debut he was in a borrowed car, a Lotus Elan, owned by Dick Yagami (who would later do aerodynamic work for Dyson Racing on their Porsche 962 GTP car) and shepherded for the occasion by Pete Mullen, one of the key technicians at Datsun's powerhouse of the era, Bob Sharp Racing.



The Thompson race was an obscure event on a busy calendar and the only on-lookers for the occasion were the other racers, which suited PLN just fine. It is probably fair to say he did make a favorable impression on the usually blasé' female contingent on hand. Later, even at club races, there would be star-struck crowds to contend with.







Among the current MoHud members on hand, including myself, Clark Nicholls, and Dave Hathaway the recollection is that PLN performed competently. He didn't win, but his performance was good enough to garner a trophy, which Nancy Geer, wife of MoHud's Regional Executive Howard Geer, got to present in-person at Lime Rock a few weeks later.



Paul Newman's passion for racing would extend more than three decades. He continued to drive into his 80s, and along the way he scored numerous SCCA club victories, several National Championships, along with professional racing wins in the Trans Am Series and the IMSA Rolex 24, as well as a runner-up finish in the 1979 24 Hours of Le Mans.

And it all started with Mohawk-Hudson Region, June 16-17, 1972.
