THE ANNUAL KO GIFT GUIDE

CAMPBELL RACING – RUNOFFS VIR, SUNDAY – THE FINAL RACE DAY

And what a day it was! The F Production race was the third of the day, scheduled to start at 10:15 AM. The forecast called for rain to start in the afternoon, but a very light rain started in the middle of the second race. It was just a heavy mist but did start to affect the track conditions near the end of that race. Of course, we, of the third race, were now confronted with the decision of which tires to use – was it going to stop raining or begin raining harder? The forecasts on Friday and Saturday predicted rain all day Sunday so I did most of the work to get the car set up for rain on Saturday – this was, after all, the hurricane weekend. But, early Sunday morning the forecast was clear of rain until after noon. So, I undid all the rain set up. Now here was the rain and it didn't show any signs of letting up. But it wasn't heavy, there wasn't any standing water on the track. We chose to put on the "intermediate" wet tires rather than the full wet "rain" tires. The intermediates are a set of slicks that we (Charlie) modified with some hand cut grooves to provide some channels for the water to get out from under the tires to avoid aquaplaning. It turned out to be the right choice. On the grid there were all the alternatives: full rains, intermediates, and a few on dry (slick) tires. A couple of drivers apparently decided they didn't want to play in the rain under any circumstances.

Charlie started 4th, behind the Miata of Eric Prill on the pole, the Acura of Ken Kannard, and the Honda del Sol of Cliff Ira. It was chaos going into the first turn; one poor guy was punted off course in the jockeying for position even before the turn and his race was done within seconds of the green flag. But all was sorted out and Charlie came around in third place when the 2nd place starter, Kannard's Acura, went off course and fell back in the pack.

Charlie came around in the lead at the end of lap 2, with Kevin Ruck's Acura right on this rear bumper and Prill's a Miata couple seconds back in third. He continued to lead laps 2 through 6. But on lap 7 Charlie got out of control starting down the hill to the front straight and fell back to 2nd, now behind the Acura. On lap 8 Prill got around him, dropping Charlie to 3rd. But on lap

10 he was back in 2nd, then Prill got by again and Charlie was back to 3rd. At the end of the next to last lap it was Ruck's Acura; Prill's Miata back by 1.1 seconds, and Charlie in 3rd by 0.7 seconds. And coming to the finish line at the end of the last lap it was Prill in 1st by 0.2 seconds over Ruck, with Charlie half a second behind in 3rd place.
