THE REPORT

Hello all,

I want to thank everyone in MoHud for the opportunity to be the Regional Executive of this wonderful club. I started with the SCCA and Mohud in 2016 when I was looking to do some performance driving with my WRX. I talked to a coworker about Autocrosses and he mentioned that there was a club that held events every month at the base of 787. I went in July and became hooked immediately, acquiring my SCCA membership the next day. For 4 years I competed in my WRX, then a pair of go karts, as well as my mustang and any vehicle that the owner was willing to codrive with me. The more events I attended the more familiar with the club I became, befriending Tracy as she was heading the junior kart program. She invited me to my first meeting (about 10 minutes from my home) in 2019 which gave me more insight into the administration of the club that I hadn't thought of prior.

2020 was definitely an interesting year. Our chief of peer pressure Adam Wright got me out to the national time trial at Thompson. There were many attempts to get me to take my car out and compete, but for this event I chose to just help out on the grid. This was my first time at a circuit track and again I was addicted. Later that year I did make it on track at a non-SCCA event at Thompson, but the biggest draw came in October that year. Our current assistant RE and prior RE EJ Smith enticed me to come out and flag the NER club racing season closer. I was assigned to turn 1 and the first session of the weekend the "wing and things" class had a 3 car pile up as the station captain was explaining to me what the yellow flag means. I knew that eventually I would want to be out with the insanity, but for the following year focused on flagging.

At the end of 2020 I took notice of a post mentioning that elections were coming up for MoHud. I inquired about the treasurer position, but did not realize that the previous holder of the position was interested in retaining it. However, as EJ was going to be the RE as the previous RE moving to Florida there was an opening at assistant RE. After hearing what the position entailed I expressed interest and for the last 3 years I served as the assistant RE. This year EJ, after doing an amazing job holding the reins for 3 years, was looking to step down from being the leader of the club, opening up the opportunity for me to become the RE. Thankfully EJ stayed on the board as the assistant RE to help share what he has learned from his tenure as assistant RE and RE in the past.

As RE I want to ensure that all interests in our region get the support we need. For our autox program we will continue to look for a site as we are unsure of the future of the site that PSCC has generously shared with us the last few years. Full text of the awards presentation at the 2024 Annual Meeting by Tracey Burckhard:

Welcome to the 2023 portion of the Mohawk Hudson Solo Awards. I want to start off by thanking the Poughkeepsie Sports Car Club. We also need to thank the Mohawk Hudson Region's Board of Directors, Solo Advisory Committee, Members, and all the participants. We couldn't have done this without any of you.

Poughkeepsie was gracious enough to give us the months of July and August to hold our events. This allowed us to have 4 events this season. The July events had Mother Nature threatening us with some rain and that kept attendance low for those two events. August was better and our numbers went up. Attendance dropped a bit compared to 2022. We only averaged 39 participants at each event compared to 53 from the previous year. We had a total of 74 different entrants, 12 of those made it to all 4 events, and about 31 only made one event. Street was the highest attended again this year with 23 different cars. Novice moved up and was next with 16 different cars. Pro had the same amount with 11 different cars, but moved up the list a couple spots. Street Touring had 9 different cars. Modified / Prepared had 7 different cars. CAM had lost half and went to 4, and Street Prepared stayed with 3. With four events this year compared to three from the previous year, It is not surprising to see these amounts change.

2022 Cone Hunter

Cones hit were down again this year compared to the previous two years, only 213 were hit in 2023 compared to 372 that were hit in 2022 and 685 in 2021. While there is a big difference in these numbers and we had 1 more event which should have suggested more cones but the total amount of runs taken was within 25 (less) of 2022. The average cones per run almost dropped in half and stayed close to an average of .18 throughout the season. 20 competitors didn't hit any cones but had 22 of the 72 DNF's. The top seventeen competitors had 5 or more cones and 19 of the DNF's. The top ten had at least 7 or more cones and a combined total of 91 cones or almost half of all the cones hit. This is way down from the 123 cones from the top ten 2022. Trevor Lowe, Phil Redington, and Joe Lagdao had 7cones apiece. Sheri DeJan and Greg Burckhard had 8. This leaves the top 6. Nigel Boyce, Scott Monti, and Max Lux Ramos Just missed out of hitting 10 cones while Novice, Chris Walker was the first in the 10-cone club and did it in the only event that he attended. This leaves the top 2 tied with 12 cones each. The runner up was on the top ten list last year while the winner worked his way up the chart from last year hitting the most cones and going off course 2 times securing his victory over Tracey Burckhard. The 2023 Cone Hunter is Carmine Russo.

Most improved.

A lot of the time, the winner of this award comes from the Novice class in the previous year but this year is different. Sometimes the driver gets a new ride, makes major upgrades, or changes class. This didn't happen either. In 2022 he had a 40th place pax at the first event, he improved to a 35th place and a 31st place finish in the final event last year. This year he started with a pair of

7th place pax finishes and then dropped to a 19th place pax in a borrowed car which by the way he finished 1.4 seconds ahead of the owner. He Probably would have improved his average if he hadn't missed the final event and used his own car. The 2023 Most Improved winner is Paul Beechner.

Worker of the Year

This award goes to someone that is always willing to help us out. He always is around to help with whatever needs to be done. Along with his many regular contributions such as course marking, set up, and clean up. This year he helped us to be able to hold the events thanks to his computer knowledge when we were having timing communication issues. The 2023 worker of the year winner is Phil DeJan

Novice Driver of the Year

We had 8 drivers competing in Novice this year. All these competitors had at least 2 events and unfortunately, only one of them was able to make all four events. The Highest Pax results for the winner was an impressive 13th at his first event. His Next event was 22nd followed by a 15th and finally a 19th making his average Pax for the year around 17th. This places him in the top half of the entire Pax list for 2023. Our novice runner up, Jordan Lourie, had a slightly better Pax average. Unfortunately, Jordan was only able to make two events and it would have been nice to see that battle play out. The winner's class results had three wins and a second-place finish. The 2023 Novice Driver of the year is Jeremy Corriveau.

Female Driver of the Year

We had 6 women competing this year with only two making it to all four of the events. She was at the top of her class as the champion with 3 seconds and a 5th place finish. Her Pax finishes were 4th, 5th, 6th, and 14th. She Trophied (3rd) in the Ladies street tire bump class at the 2023 Seneca National Tour and was a close 3rd place finisher at the 2023 SCCA National Championships. The 2023 Female Driver of the year is Tracey Burckhard.

2022 Driver of the year

This driver has been a tough competitor over the last couple of years. He had two firsts, a fourth, and a second on Pax this year for a 2.0 average. And he is Champion in his class with a third, a second, and two firsts. He also won his class at the 2023 Seneca National Tour and finished mid pack in his first Solo Nationals. For the second year in a row as Driver of the Year, the 2023 Driver of the year is Nigel Boyce.
